2026 Animal Control Agreement with Jay County Humane Society

Motion by Leonhard, seconded by McIntosh to approve the 2026 Animal Control Agreement in the amount of \$48,180. Chair voted aye.

INDOT Street Sweeping agreement; July 2025 thru June 2029

Motion by Leonhard, seconded by McIntosh to approve the agreement in the amount of \$2,304 per year. Per the agreement, the city must sweep a total of 6.4 curb miles a minimum of two times per year. Chair voted aye.
